The School of Behavioral Sciences is the institution of choice for training psychologists in areas of significant national importance. We are the largest graduate psychology program in the country and have over 1,300 students enrolled across both undergraduate and graduate programs. Our students benefit from a comprehensive curriculum grounded in theoretical and methodological psychology, and the personalized attention afforded by a small-classroom setting. Our students learn a professional, multidisciplinary perspective of psychological understanding and treatment.



OUR DEGREES

Our degrees give students the opportunity to study at one of Israel's most well-respected psychology schools. Students benefit from a vibrant, dynamic faculty and uncompromising standards of academic excellence.

B.A. IN PSYCHOLOGY

This three-year track equips students with the knowledge and research skills required of behavioral science students. Students build a strong theoretical foundation in core areas of psychology and research methods through intensive courses and seminars. Students can choose a specialization in User Experience, Human Resource Management, or Sports and Exercise.

M.A. IN PSYCHOLOGY (with or without thesis)

The School of Behavioral Sciences is the only psychology program in the country to offer a Master's degree and professional certification in each of the six Ministry of Health-recognized specialties. For this reason, the program is considered one of the most prestigious in the country. In this degree, students acquire extensive knowledge and clinical skills, preparing them to provide critical care to those in need, as well as conduct high-level research. A critical component of each degree is the practical experience and field training students receive throughout their studies. The six specializations are Clinical Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Health Psychology, Rehabilitation Neuropsychology, Occupational Psychology, and Educational Psychology.

RESEARCH INSTITUTE

Mifrasim Institute for Psychotherapy Research and Training

The Mifrasim Institute promotes ongoing education and training for mental health professionals as well as research in psychotherapy. The institute benefits from collaborations between leading members of the Faculty and key psychotherapy researchers from Israel and the world.

Since the October 7th Massacre, the Mifrasim Institute has been a hub for psychotherapy professionals seeking to improve the quality of care they provide to those who experienced significant trauma and loss. What began as informal exchanges quickly developed into a dedicated training program meant to share best practices for individual and group therapy providers. To date, more than 1,000 professionals, including psychologists, psychiatrists, social workers, creative therapists, and educational counselors have received training, representing a significant national resilience-building effort.

OUR LEADERSHIP



Haim Einat is the Dean of the School of Behavioral Sciences. He holds degrees in biomedical sciences, zoology, neuroscience, and psychopharmacology from Ben Gurion University, Tel Aviv University, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, and McMaster University. Professor Einat has over 130 publications and approximately 6000 citations and serves on editorial boards and as a reviewer for numerous scientific journals. 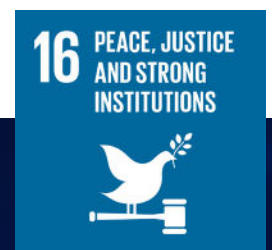
